

"A DIFFERENT KIND OF LENT"

Don't be alarmed. Lent will still be observed at First Church. It's just that we're using the 6-week framework from Ash Wednesday to Easter morning to include a lot of church activities that are not strictly Lenten.

Why are we doing this? One reason is to pursue the goal we proclaim on our website, boasting that First Church is "A Place of Worship and Community". And so Lent will begin with traditional Ash Wednesday worship, incorporating a simple meal of soup and bread into the service that also includes Holy Communion and the imposition of ashes.

And a number of similar observances of the season will follow, all of them intended to work toward Lent's purpose of providing opportunity to examine our faith, and reshape our lives.

For example, we will offer a sixweek Wednesday-night course called "Faithful Citizenship," which reaches beyond the hyper -partisanship of a presidential election year to understand our role as citizens, and Christians, from the standpoint of covenant, community, and the common good. So we'll leave behind the candidate debates, Fox News, and MSNBC, and focus instead on how scripture and Christian tradition form "faithful citizens."

That's a typical educational offering in Lent. But where this season differs are in the other events that will populate the Lenten calendar, activities and gatherings not religious in nature but very much designed to bolster First Church's reputation as "a place of community".

There will be a wide offering of musical concerts, from the Amherst Bel Canto youth choirs, to anniversary performances on the Noehren organ, to "Jazz on the Circle" gatherings.

The new Chapel Labyrinth will provide a regular opportunity to engage the public during Lent. In inviting our neighbors to take

advantage of some of our most tranquil space, we're looking to underscore how this ancient practice of "kinetic meditation" crosses all sorts of faith boundaries to bring healing wherever someone might be stuck – emotionally, spiritually, intellectually.

All of this culminates in Holy Week, the seven days from Palm Sunday to Easter.

Our abiding hope is that members and friends of First Church will take advantage of all that this different Lenten season brings. But we add to that the prayer that you will be ambassadors of hospitality for First Church in Lent, and extend warm and sincere invitations to family, friends, and yes, even strangers, to the richness of the season that God has created for us to share.


