Spiritual Inspiration

FOLLOWING THE WAY OF CHRIST

What does it mean to be someone that follows the way of Christ? It can be a confusing venture, filled with verses from the *Torah*, letters to ancient churches, and quotes from Jesus. The message, however, remains consistent.

It is easy to take verses out of context. Pulling random verses to validate insecurities can be a struggle, but we must look at the Bible as a complete story. One good way to study the Bible is by reading an entire letter in one sitting and then returning to it to read individual chapters week by week. A great letter to read over this summer is Paul's letter to the church at Colossae.



In Colossians 3:12-14, Paul shares the following:

"12 Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. 13 Bear with each other and

forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. 14 And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."



This Bible book is a reminder of God's overwhelming love, shown to the world through Jesus. Through this short passage, we can be reminded of what it means to follow in the way of Christ because we saw Him act out this way of life.



Jesus showed compassion, weeping alongside the family and friends of Lazarus at his tomb (John 11:33-35). Jesus showed kindness by spending time with Zacchaeus, sharing a meal with him and his family, and not allowing Zacchaeus' opinion of himself to be how Jesus thought of him (Luke 19:1-10).

Jesus showed humility by caring for others, not about ownership (Matthew 8:20). Jesus was gentle, even intervening in others' attempts to stone a woman (John 8:7). Jesus was patient, showing the holes in His hands and side to Thomas when he doubted (John 20:24-29). Jesus forgave by taking on our sins (2 Corinthians 5:21).



Jesus loved in these concrete and applicable ways. We can follow in His way and be part of God's restorative work in our world.

February, March, and April, at a special meeting on January 30, and by the congregation at the Annual Meeting in February.

- Allowed Pastor Alexis and the El Shaddai congregation to use First Church chapel on Sunday afternoons at 3:00 until repairs are finished on their church building.

- Agreed to hold the Annual Meeting on February 5, 2023.

- Elected Mark Armesto (1) to the Board of Deacons, Class of 2023.
- Authorized the Clerk to cast a single, unanimous ballot to elect Pat Harmon (1), Pat Frey (1), and Suzanne Pilon (1) to Session, Class of 2025.
- Reelected the Corporate Board: James Gardner, President; Don Houck, Vice President; Mark Armesto, Treasurer, and Janet Hill, Secretary.
- Elected Jonathan Cox to the 2023 Nominating Committee.

Sweet & Savory Summer Recipes

Pat Harmon (nee Matteson at the time), submitted this sure-fire hit of a cool salad. While Rosa Marina pasta is specified as an ingredient, any orzo pasta should do nicely. Enjoy this fruit-juicy presentation at a family/friends picnic or your own backyard barbeque. Yummy variation of ambrosia, it's guaranteed to please sweet salad fanciers.

Pat's "Kathy's Party Salad"

Ingredients:

- 1 box Rosa Marina pasta #37 or 35.
- 2 15-oz. cans chunk pineapple.
- 1 can of mandarin oranges
- 3/4 cups of sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 tablespoons of flour
- 1/2 teaspoon of salt
- 1 (16-ounce) container of whipped topping

<u>Directions</u>: Drain juice from pineapple and oranges, and set aside fruit. Add sugar, eggs, flour, and salt to juices. Boil until thick. Add to cooked noodles and set overnight. Cut in half the pineapple chunks. Add 1/4 cup of chopped nuts or coconut, mandarin oranges, and 1/2 jar maraschino cherries. Add fruit to noodles. Mix with 1 medium container of Cool Whip™ or generic brand. Pat notes that a friend of a friend shared this recipe, which yields a large portion.

You can't get more summery or flavorful than **Jean Hess**'s barbeque sauce contribution. Get out your grill and go to town with this one. Conveniently easy to assemble, it renders delightfully delicious results!



Jean's "Cornell BBQ Sauce" (for chicken)

Ingredients:

1 egg, beaten

1 cup of cider vinegar

1/3 cup of salad oil

1-1/2 tablespoons of salt

1-1/2 teaspoons of poultry seasoning

1/4 teaspoons of pepper

1 bay leaf

<u>Directions</u>: Marinate chicken in sauce for an hour. Broil on grill, basting and turning chicken every 10 (ten) minutes. This recipe makes enough for 5 (five) broiler halves.
