You're a Born Leader!

"A rabbinical student, it is said, had a dream, and in his dream the Almighty appeared to him and told him he would become an influential rabbi. The student told this to his teacher. 'Pray,' said his teacher, 'that the Almighty appears in the dreams of others and persuades them to become your followers.'"

That clever and amusing little story says a lot of things about leaders and the circumstances of communities of faith. Faith communities struggle with two things right now – anointing leaders, and attracting followers.

And it's on that premise that I open the first newsletter of 2020 with an appeal to the congregation to do both – to step into leadership, and to follow those who lead. The paragraphs below describe some specific areas of leadership that lie open to the good people of First Church this year.

But before I get to that, let me underscore that leadership in the church does not necessarily involve being the person who heads committees, speaks in public, and corrals volunteers (think the 'herding cats' image!). These are facets of leadership – some of the most dreaded – but they are not leadership in its entirety.

In fact, Christian leadership following the example of Jesus often occurs out of the limelight and reveals itself in a thousand different "small strokes" that taken together form the faithful community and the spirit of commitment that our church seeks.

So, maybe you consider yourself a "born leader." Or, like our imaginary rabbinical student above, you've heard the voice of the Almighty urging you to take up a calling. Either way, please think hard and long, and prayerfully, about how your gifts could take First Church to a new place in 2020, as a leader *and* a follower. The Nominating Committee will be active in the coming weeks in connection with the following. Be blessed.

At the beginning of each year, the Nominating Committee begins its search for new officers of the church by seeking candidates for various church offices. This leads to a congregational meeting later in the year at which a slate of candidates is presented to serve three-year terms (or fill unexpired terms) on the Session, the Board of Deacons, and the Corporate Board.

Serving in leadership is a significant commitment of time and talent—but it also allows individuals to move deeper into service and further along their faith journey, and creates stronger ties within our beloved community. The responsibilities of these varied offices are described on the next page.

Elders

Each year four new Elders are called to join the Session and the clergy to exercise leadership, government and discipline for the life of the church. With primary responsibility for nurturing and overseeing the spiritual and theological life of the congregation, the Session meets monthly during the program year. Each Elder serves on at least one committee, with periodic meetings and tasks. Elders participate in worship by serving as liturgists and serving communion .

Deacons

Likewise, candidates are called each year to join the Board of Deacons, serving as the church's primary resource for pastoral care. Deacons meet periodically during the program year and serve on an ongoing basis in home and hospital visitation, celebrating communion, and responding to crucial life needs as they arise in the congregation. Deacons sponsor special celebrations during the year, including meals, and participate in worship by greeting, ushering, and collecting offerings.

Corporate Board Officers

Four Corporate Board members are called (or renewed) each year to assume responsibility for the financial and business affairs of the church, reporting to the Session. The number, timing, and content of Corporate Board meetings may be tied to budget cycles, strategic planning goals, and endowment and investment review schedules.

FROM THE ORGAN BENCH

The Noehren organ was completed 50 years ago – January 1970. (Not really old for an organ. There are numerous ones in Europe that are over 200!) The event was celebrated with a dedication recital and the organ was featured in performances as part of the national convention of the American Guild of Organists held in Buffalo in June 1970.

The builder, Robert Noehren, was a Buffalo native, growing up on Main Street in a house next to what is now the Anchor Bar. He was organist for a number of years at St. John's Grace on Colonial Circle. (Roch Harmon was a <u>boy</u> <u>soprano</u> in his choir as well as Betty Kinnen's first husband, Gene Drullard). Noehren eventually became professor of organ at the University of Michigan and opened a small organ building shop in Ann Arbor. He made numerous trips to Europe to study old organs and incorporated much of what he learned into his 2 dozen instruments. Ours was the last and largest one he made.


In appreciation of this unique instrument, we will be offering several organ recitals this spring and probably into next Fall as well. The first two are:

Houghton College Buffalo: Hope House

Sunday February 16 after service in the Houghton Library

Numerous studies show that higher education reduces the likelihood of returning to jail/prison after being released. Despite this fact, federal and state funding for college-inprison programs is virtually nonexistent--and pursuing higher education post-release is challenging. **Houghton College Buffalo: Hope House** opened in 2017 to address these challenges; **offering an Associate of Arts degree program for justice-involved and at-risk students in Erie County.** Individuals with criminal convictions face a multiplicity of issues and case management services are provided for those in the program through Peaceprints of WNY.

Come learn about efforts to bring back funding for college-inprison programs and the work being done at Houghton College Buffalo: Hope House! We will also hear a bit about national and local concerns relating to the "revolving door" of prison. Our presenter is Rebekah Kimble, the former Program Director at Hope House. Ms. Kimble recently became a research associate at Via Evaluation. This company helps nonprofits, foundations, schools, districts, and universities understand and use data for program development, community building and grant writing.
